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THE PRINCIPAL MADRID

Dazzling views of Madrid and contemporary design are the order of the day at this city hotspot

e Madrid al cielo (from Madrid to heaven) is how madrileños describe the skyline of their city, and hotelier Pau Guardans has certainly taken this mantra to heart. His latest venture in the centre of town places all the action, from informal check-in to fine dining, on the sixth and seventh floors, so guests can enjoy panoramic views over the Spanish capital.

Behind the palatial Renaissance-style façade on the famous Gran Vía, the hotel's décor suggests Manhattan loft-meets-French château, with marble floors, stained-glass windows and high ceilings providing a backdrop for earthy tones and contemporary

furniture. The magnificent sixth-floor Ático or penthouse (above left) incorporates a sun room, restaurant and bar, where the mix of 1950s coffee tables, deep leather chesterfields and Indian teak benches is set off by drapes in dusty rose and tangerine. On the floor below, bedrooms decorated in cool greys and mustard yellows feature design classics such as BFK's Butterfly Chair and Manel Ybargüengoitia's 1970s lamps, as well as works by Spanish artist Albert Coma. The icing on the cake is the seventh-floor rooftop, where striking 360-degree views of the city can be enjoyed from the laid-back terrace studded with olive trees.

NEED TO KNOW

- The hotel's 76 rooms and suites are decorated in muted colours, with bathrooms in black, white, slate and gold. Many rooms offer views of the Gran Vía. Prices start from £145 per night, including breakfast.
- The restaurant menu is created by renowned chef Ramón Freixa, who holds two Michelin stars at sister Hotel Único Madrid.
- On the seventh floor, the deck of La Terraza is home to 20 sunbeds, two outdoor showers and an elegant water feature.
