

/ hen it came to renovating their detached Georgian-style home, the owners of this Oxfordshire property looked overseas for inspiration. 'We have friends in the US and the idea of the classic American "great room", a versatile open-plan living and cooking space, has always appealed to us,' says owner Amanda Netherton. 'That was the starting point for a new rear extension in which the kitchen, overlooking a west-facing garden and pool, is at the heart.'

The family wanted a practical and luxurious space that could accommodate generous storage, several ovens and a pair of wine fridges for entertaining. They turned to be poke kitchen specialists Harvey Jones, whose Original range was adapted to create a streamlined look. 'We eschewed some of the traditional elements such as tongue-and-groove and decorative end panelling in

favour of a cleaner finish,' says head of design Melissa Klink. 'The design grew around the location of the sink, overlooking the garden. To its left, a large bank of custom tulipwood cabinetry houses storage and appliances, while a generous, polished Carrara-topped island is a natural focal point.'

A blend of ergonomics and aesthetics are the hallmark of this deceptively simple scheme: Miele dishwashers are discreetly housed by the sink for ease; two removable chopping boards and a wooden storage drawer add a subtle touch of oak to the otherwise painted cabinetry, and a concealed drawer bin is incorporated into the island. Freestanding elements, such as a painted breakfast dresser, provide that all-important  $\triangleright$

multi-functional feel. 'The dresser is one of our favourite elements,' says Amanda. 'It links the kitchen to the dining area and houses our glasses as well as a customised wine rack.' Painted cabinetry conceals copious storage, including electrical sockets for small appliances. A large crystal chandelier over the adjacent dining table adds drama, while oak flooring throughout links the dining, living and cooking areas. 'Adding this extension has given the house a new lease of life,' concludes Amanda. 'We spend a great deal of our time here. Our daughter loves to cook when she is home from university, and we enjoy hosting Sunday lunches or drinks in the summer, which inevitably spill into the garden. It's a relaxed yet supremely comfortable way of living which suits us perfectly.'
